




Spring Courses for Tanakh Teachers

Starting Sunday March 5, Herzog Global is offering four new online courses for Torah and Navi teachers:









Each course comprises 12 lessons - two live on Zoom and 10 asynchronous (online materials for self-study with questions and discussions) - plus a weekly assignment. There are no tests. Each course requires approximately 1.5 hours of study per week and costs just \$75. All Zoom lessons take place on Sundays at 8:00 pm Israel time, and they are scheduled so that teachers can take more than one course per semester.

These accredited courses are part of our Masters-level Tanakh Teaching Certificate Program of academic courses, designed to equip teachers with advanced Tanakh knowledge and practical pedagogy skills.

Teaching Tanakh Herzog-Style

Herzog College lecturers, such as Rabbi Yoel Bin Nun, HaRav Yaakov Medan, Professor Jonathan Grossman, Professor Yael Ziegler and Rav Menachem Leibtag, are known around the world for their unique approach to the study of Tanakh. The course will be taught by Rav Dr. Shuki Reiss, head of Tanakh at Herzog College, and Rav Daniel Wolf, a graduate of Yeshiva Har Etzion and Herzog College, who taught for seven years at the Fuchs Mizrachi School in Cleveland and at the Pardes Educators' Program in Jerusalem.

Rav Wolf explains: "The Herzog method has transformed the way that Tanakh is taught in Israel. We will demonstrate how we can use this exciting educational approach to uncover the breadth and depth of the Tanakh through methodological analysis of the text, and explore what it teaches us about moral values and contemporary human themes."
